## **ENG 213 Creative Nonfiction**

In the words of Guthrie, creative nonfiction is "true stories, well told". In this class, we will study the craft tools of fiction writers and poets to tell true stories, in a compelling way. We will do this by using a variety of forms such as memoir, travel essay and prose poem.

To succeed in this course, you will need a fairly good grasp of English; a love for reading and writing; a few stories brewing in you and waiting to be told; and a soft spot for poetry as we can learn loads about storytelling from poets.

This is a small class, around 15 students. Class meetings will be held on Zoom and ODTU Class, and attendance will be mandatory. There will be reading and writing tasks each week and this will require an average of 2 to 3 hours of study weekly, in addition to the online class. Each student will need a Scribd account. Scribd is an online reading platform, which is free for the first 60 days and around TL25 each month thereafter. It comes with a free Mubi membership as a gift. Mubi is a curated film platform and we will use it in class as we can learn loads about storytelling from film-makers, as well. This class also relies on critique of each other's writing, so you should be willing to share your pieces and give gentle and constructive feedback to your peers.
